BUFFALO WATER BOARD MINUTES October 13, 2021

The regular monthly meeting of the Buffalo Water Board was called to order at 8:00 a.m.

- 1. Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Mr. Kelly to approve the agenda. Approved
- 2. Motion by Ms. Brown, seconded by Mr. Sunderlin to approve the minutes from the September 22, 2021 meeting. Approved.
- 3. Mr. Ramos reported that the City Department of Permits and Inspections continues to support the work of the Buffalo Water Board. He attends various community events and Block Club meetings, making presentations to these groups. He offered to add information pertaining to the American Rescue Act assistance programs and the City's ROLL program into the presentations.
- 4. Staff Update: Mr. Hill with Veolia Water provided a staffing update to the Buffalo Water Board.
- 5. Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Brown to adopt Buffalo Water Board Resolution Regarding Adoption of 2021 Capital Improvement Plan and State Environmental Quality Review Act and attached hereto. Approved.
- 6. Upon the recommendation of the Principal Engineer of the Division of Water, motion made by Mr. Kelly, seconded by Ms. Brown to authorize and fund an increase to the Veolia Water Specialty Maintenance Limit Account in an amount not-to-exceed \$350,000.00. The project and contract will be administered by the City of Buffalo, Division of Water, as part of the Veolia Water Management Agreement. Approved.
- 7. Upon the recommendation of the Principal Engineer of the Division of Water and GHD Consulting Services, Inc., motion made by Ms. Brown, seconded by Mr. Sunderlin to authorize and fund a contract with Promise Network Inc. for assistance with the Buffalo Water Board's Affordability and Financial Assistance Programs. The project and contract will be administered

by the City of Buffalo, Division of Water in an amount not-to-exceed \$475,000.00 over a period of three years. Approved.

8. Mr. Waldvogel and Mr. Steiner of GHD Consulting Services, Inc. delivered a report of GHD's on-going professional services to assist the Buffalo Water Board on a number of projects, including: GHD has progressed the RFP process to recommend Promise Network Inc. as a third party vendor to manage the Buffalo Water Board Affordability and Financial Assistance Programs. GHD is also collaborating with Veolia Water and 120 Water with regard to replacing Lead Based water services; and working to complete outfall work. GHD is also engaged in preparing the Engineer's report in support of the Buffalo Water Board and Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority's proposed bond refunding and new money bond sale this year.

GHD is also continuing to provide engineering and oversight services at Colonel Ward Treatment Facility, for among other matters, the sodium hypochloride system design, the electrical design at the plant, continued work on the Pipe Loop Project, working on outfalls at the facility, the flood protection model which is nearing completion and finishing filter plant upgrades.

9. Mr. Hill of Veolia Water presented Veolia Water's monthly management report with the Buffalo Water Board. Mr. Hill noted that through the first three months of this fiscal year revenue collected has increased approximately \$225,000 from the same time period last year, despite production rates remaining relatively low. He reported that due to equipment improvements at the Massachusetts Avenue Pumping Station, the Buffalo Water Board is now capable of operating that facility remotely within the next month. The US Army Corps of Engineers has completed its project replacing Outfall #5 from a manhole on site to the outfall wall at the Niagara River. A new 48-inch pipe for Outfall #3 has been installed. This month the City of Buffalo Fire Department will conduct training on site for excavation certifications with shoring and ditch collapse response and rescue training. Customer Service area renovations have been completed at the Exchange Street offices and video monitors have been installed. Veolia Water will schedule and coordinate meetings with Buffalo Water Board to explain in detail the 5th liter sampling program that Veolia Water and 120 Water are developing.

Motion by Ms. Brown, seconded by Mr. Sunderlin to adjourn at 9:30 A.M. Approved.

RESOLUTION OF THE BUFFALO WATER BOARD REGARDING ADOPTION OF 2021 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND STATE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY REVIEW ACT

WHEREAS, the Buffalo Water Board (the "Water Board") is authorized to establish and from time to time amend a capital improvement plan pursuant to the New York State Public Authorities Law section 1048-g, and the Financing Agreement (the "Financing Agreement") and the Operation Agreement (the "Operation Agreement") by and among the Water Board, the City of Buffalo (the "City") and the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority (the "Water Authority") dated as of September 24, 1992, as amended, with respect to the water treatment plant, water distribution system and related water facilities of the Water Board (the "Water System"); and

WHEREAS, the Water Board regularly serves as the lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), to review potential environmental impacts of its capital improvement plans, and works in cooperation with the Water Authority and the City to finance and implement such capital improvement plan; and

WHEREAS, GHD Consulting Services, Inc., as the Consulting Engineer for the Water Board, has recommended a capital improvement plan for 2021, as more particularly set forth and described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof (the "2021 Capital Improvement Plan"), which the Water Board plans to adopt and finance with the assistance of the Water Authority's bonds and the Water Board's own reserves and other resources; and

WHEREAS, the Water Board has reviewed the 2021 Capital Improvement Plan and determined that such projects consist of studies, engineering plans and improvements that constitute planning, maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in any existing Water System structure or facility, and/or replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of such structures, facilities, in kind, on the same site(s), including upgrading buildings, infrastructure and equipment to comply with building and fire codes, and/or improve energy or operational efficiency, without causing any significant adverse impact on the environment, and in accordance with the SEQRA criteria for significant adverse environmental impacts, and 6 NYCRR section 617.5, determined that no further environmental review is necessary or appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The Water Board, as lead agency, hereby determines that the 2021 Capital Improvement Plan constitutes SEQRA Type II action(s), and that the proposed action(s) will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts, and no further environmental review is necessary or appropriate pursuant to 6 NYCRR section 617.5.
- 2. The Water Board hereby approves and adopts the 2021 Capital Improvement Plan, and directs the Water Board Secretary or any other officer of the Water Board to publish a notice of public hearing to afford the public an opportunity to comment on the amendment to the Financing Agreement incorporating the 2021 Capital Improvement Plan in compliance with the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority Act.

- 3. The Water Board expects that it will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with the improvements of the City Water System prior to the issuance of bonds, loans, notes or other instruments of tax-exempt indebtedness issued by the Water Authority ("Obligations"), and reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of such Obligations. The Water Board hereby declares its official intent to use proceeds of the Obligations to reimburse itself for future expenditures in connection with such improvements to the City Water System. This section of the Resolution is adopted for the purpose of establishing compliance with the requirements of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations to enable such reimbursements.
- 4. The Water Board Chair, or such other officer of the Water Board, and any person as the Chair may designate is authorized to publish such notices and other documents and to execute and deliver all instruments and documents as required by the New York Public Authorities Law, and other applicable law and the Financing Agreement and the Operation Agreement with respect to compliance with SEQRA and the adoption of the 2021 Capital Improvement Plan.

At a meeting of the Buffalo Water Board, convened on October 13, 2021 in public session at the Colonel Ward Water Treatment Plant, Buffalo, New York, and/or, via remote video and sound access, as authorized by the New York State Governor's Executive Order the foregoing resolution, was offered by Mr. Sunderlin and seconded by Ms. Brown, and with a quorum present throughout the meeting, such resolution was duly adopted by unanimous vote of the Buffalo Water Board.
