OTHERS PRESENT:

The regular monthly meeting of the Buffalo Water Board (BWB) was called to order at 9:30 a.m. It also constitutes the Buffalo Water Board's annual meeting in accordance with the Board's By-laws.

- 1. Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to approve the agenda, as amended. Approved.
- 2. Motion by Ms. Jackson, seconded by Mr. Sunderlin to approve the minutes of the June 21, 2023, meeting, as amended. Approved.
- 3. Public Comment: After the Chair offered an opportunity for public comments, no comments were received.
- 4. Staff Update: Mr. Hill and Mr. Fultz, with Veolia Water provided a staffing update to the Buffalo Water Board.
- 5. Election of Officers: Mr. McFoy continues pursuant to Mayoral appointment, as authorized by law, as Chair of the Buffalo Water Board. Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to approve Mr. McFoy as Chair of the Buffalo Water Board. Approved. Motion by Ms. Jackson, seconded by Mr. Kelly to approve Mr. Sunderlin as Vice Chair of the Buffalo Water Board. Approved.

- 6. Election of Officers: Motion by Ms. Jackson, seconded by Mr. Sunderlin to nominate and elect Mr. Merlo as Secretary and FOIL Officer of the Buffalo Water Board. Approved. Motion by Ms. Jackson, seconded by Mr. Sunderlin to nominate and elect Mr. McMahon as Assistant Secretary of the Buffalo Water Board. Approved. The City Comptroller is the Chief Financial Officer of the Buffalo Water Board.
- 7. Governance Committee: Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Mr. Kelly to nominate Ms. Jackson as Chair of the Governance Committee of the Buffalo Water Board. Approved.
- 8. Audit Committee: Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to nominate Mr. Kelly as Chair of the Audit Committee of the Buffalo Water Board. Approved.
- 9. PAAA Compliance: The Buffalo Water Board reviewed the Buffalo Water Board's Mission Statement and Performance Goals established pursuant to the New York State Public Authorities Accountability Act, as amended (PAAA), as attached hereto. Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to confirm and restate the Buffalo Water Board's adoption of such Mission Statement and Performance Goals. Approved.
- 10. PAAA: Directors Confidential Evaluations are to be completed by each Buffalo Water Board member and delivered to the Buffalo Water Board legal counsel.
- 11. Motion made by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to approve a Resolution to Schedule a Public Hearing regarding rate re-structuring on August 16, 2023. Approved.
- 12. Upon the recommendation of the Associate Engineer of the Division of Water, motion made by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to approve a water betterment for a portion of the Niagara Streetscape Rehabilitation Project (Niagara 4B). The project and contract will be administered by the City of Buffalo, Division of Engineering, and the contract, as amended, is approved with an increased amount not-to-exceed \$103,945.66. Approved.
- 13. Motion made by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to approve the Amendment of the Financing Agreement (including the Approved Capital Improvement Plan). Approved.
- Mr. Waldvogel, Mr. Stotz, Mr. Davis and Mr. Steiner of GHD Consulting Services, Inc. delivered 14. a report of GHD's on-going professional services to assist the Buffalo Water Board on several projects, including: (a) GHD prepared an engineering report for bond application; (b) GHD is working with the City of Buffalo Rate Consultant developing a six year forecast of water consumption and revenue as well as developing pro-rated rate adjustments to implement this fiscal year: (c) GHD has worked with the Buffalo Water Board Legal Counsel regarding staffing concerns; (d) Mr. Davis reported on the very positive response to the continuing Public Outreach Campaign at the Get Water Wise tent at the recent 716 Community Days and the August 19th Puerto Rican Day Parade as well as positive feedback from the social media campaign; (e) Mr. Stotz reported that GHD is tracking metrics traffic focused on affordability from the cloud based environment for the Get Water Wise internet web site; (f) GHD continues to provide guidance to the City of Buffalo, Division of Water on the Replace Old Lead Lines (ROLL) Program and is collaborating with various agencies and vendors who will utilize the Get Water Wise web site to interact with customers through a customer portal; (g) GHD is continuing to provide engineering and oversight services at Colonel Ward Treatment Facility, for among other matters, electrical upgrades at the plant have commenced, bids for the Flood Mitigation Berm Project have been received and are being reviewed and contractor meetings for work at the Ralph C. Wilson Centennial Park have commenced.

Mr. Hill and Mr. Sykes of Veolia Water presented Veolia Water's monthly management report. Mr. Hill reported that the Promise Pay Program had enrolled approximately 324 customers and collected \$900,000 over 9 months. The two New York State programs that are assisting customers with payments including the New York State Homeowner Assistance Fund (helping customers with payments, with receipt of approximately \$302,000 this month) and the New York State Low Income Household Water Assistance (LIHWA) Program (helping customers with payments). Mr. Sykes provided the Buffalo Water Board with a detailed summary of the end of the Fiscal Year Review of Actual Revenues versus Budgeted Revenues, charges for this fiscal year versus the previous year, a water consumption summary, and an accounts receivables review.

Motion by Mr. Sunderlin to enter Executive Session to discuss a litigation matter. Seconded by Ms. Jackson. Approved.

Motion by Mr. Sunderlin to exit Executive Session. Seconded by Ms. Jackson. Approved.

Motion by Mr. Sunderlin, seconded by Ms. Jackson to adjourn at 11:20 A.M. Approved.

The Members of the Buffalo Water Board are appointed by the Mayor of the City of Buffalo, and confirmed by the City of Buffalo Common Council. Pursuant to the Financing Agreement by and between the City of Buffalo, the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority and the Buffalo Water Board dated as of September 24, 1992, as amended, the Buffalo Water Board uses the services of the employees and officers of the City of Buffalo, including but not limited to, the Commissioner of Public Works, Parks and Streets and the City Engineer to operate and maintain the Buffalo Water System. In addition, the Buffalo Water Board continues its engagement of Veolia Water North America-Northeast, LLC pursuant to a Management Agreement dated as of July 1, 2020, as its professional manager to manage the operation and maintenance of the Buffalo Water System.

3. If the Board appoints management, do you have a policy you follow when appointing the management of the public authority?

Yes, the policies are stated in the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority Act of the State of New York, the New York State Public Authorities Law, and other related laws of the State of New York and the Financing Agreement by and between the City of Buffalo, the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority and the Buffalo Water Board dated as of September 24, 1992, as amended.

4. Briefly describe the role of the Board and the role of management in the implementation of the mission.

The Buffalo Water Board meets regularly, in public sessions, in compliance with the New York Open Meetings Law and related laws. It regularly receives and reviews reports from the Commissioner of Public Works, Parks and Streets, the City Engineer, its independent Consulting Engineers, Legal Counsel and Auditors, and Rate Consultant regarding the operation and maintenance of the Buffalo Water System to oversee the management of the Buffalo Water System. It also works cooperatively with the United States Environmental Protection Agency, and various departments and agencies of State of New York, County of Erie, City of Buffalo, including but not limited to, City of Buffalo Commissioner of Public Works, Parks and Streets, City of Buffalo Comptroller, City of Buffalo Corporation Counsel and other City of Buffalo officers and employees and Veolia Water North America-Northeast, LLC to implement policies and procedures to achieve the mission of the Buffalo Water Board.

RESOLUTION FOR SCHEDULING A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER REVISION TO THE BUFFALO WATER BOARD SCHEDULE OF RATES, FEES AND CHARGES AND DESIGNATION AS LEAD AGENCY PURSUANT TO STATE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY REVIEW ACT

WHEREAS, the Buffalo Water Board (the "Board") was created by the New York State Public Authorities Law (the "Public Authorities Law") Section 1049, and is authorized and empowered to establish, fix and revise a Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges, which Schedule must be at least sufficient so that the water treatment plant, water distribution system and related water facilities of the Board (the "System") shall be self-sustaining in accordance with Public Authorities Law Section 1048-j; and

WHEREAS, the Board is required by the Public Authorities Law to conduct a public hearing before adopting a revision to the Board's Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges to provide an opportunity to all persons served by the System to comment on any proposed revision to such Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges;

WHEREAS, the Board plans to conduct a public hearing at which the Board will be present and interested persons will be provided an opportunity to review and comment on the Board's proposal to revise the Board's Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby designates itself as the lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), with respect to the action to adopt a revised Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges, and a notice of such lead agency designation will be sent to various involved and interested agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The Board hereby determines that it will serve as the lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), with respect to the action to adopt a revised Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges, which is hereby determined to be an unlisted action pursuant to SEQRA, and the Board has identified potentially involved and interested agencies to whom a notice of this resolution will be delivered.
- 1. The Board does hereby schedule a public hearing to take place on Wednesday, August 16, 2023 beginning at 9:00 a.m., at the Colonel Ward Treatment Plant Conference room located at the Foot of Porter Avenue, Buffalo, New York, and to the extent feasible by remote video and audio conference at which time the public will have an opportunity to be heard with regard to the Board's proposed revision to the Board's Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges to become effective October 1, 2023.
- 2. The Chairperson of the Board, or such other person as he may designate is authorized to publish notice of such public hearing as required by section 1048-j of the Public Authorities Law, and to take such other actions or publish such other notices which may be required or be appropriate to comply with applicable law with respect to such public hearing and revision of the Board's Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges. A copy of the proposed revision of the Board's Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges shall be posted on the Buffalo Water Board

website and will be available for inspection at the Office of the Secretary of the Buffalo Water Board at 602 City Hall, Buffalo, New York and the Office of the City Clerk at 1308 City Hall, Buffalo, New York.

3. The question of the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly put to a vote of the members of the Board which was adopted by unanimous vote of the members present.

SCHEDULE OF WATER RATES, FEES AND CHARGES

PART OF 21 NYCRR SECTION 10085.16

EFFECTIVE FOR ALL WATER AND SERVICES USED

ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 01, 2023.

The following annual rates and related fees and charges (in United States Dollars) shall be charged for the use or consumption of water, except where meter rates are herein specified, and other services provided by the Buffalo Water Board.

The water rates for all homeowners who by virtue of their age are eligible for the real estate property tax exemption pursuant to Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, are set forth separately.

All rates, fees and charges for water and services supplied which are not enumerated in this section shall be subject to special rates, fees and charges to be fixed by the Commissioner of Public Works, Parks and Streets, subject to the approval of the Buffalo Water Board.

Adjustment of the Schedule. This schedule of rates, fees and charges shall be subject to adjustment, as the Buffalo Water Board may determine, in its discretion, from time to time. Each year the Buffalo Water Board shall consider, as of July 1, any increases, but not decreases, based upon changes in the Consumer Price Index Northeast Urban – Class-size B/C, not seasonally adjusted, (hereinafter referred to as the Index) specified in Series Identification: CUURX100SA0LE, CUUSX100SA0LE, or comparable adjustment Index, as may be selected by the Buffalo Water Board. In the event of such increases, the Buffalo Water Board shall calculate the adjustment for each succeeding fiscal year, using the Index value determined as of June of the preceding fiscal year, which shall be subtracted from the Index value, determined as of June of the current fiscal year. The change in the Index value, if positive, but not negative, shall be multiplied by the stated percentage applied to all of the rates, fees and charges set forth herein. The product of such multiplication shall be used to adjust this schedule of rates fees and charges, together with such other factors as the Buffalo Water Board may determine prudent and appropriate, in the Buffalo Water Board's sole discretion, and in compliance with applicable law.

Residential Consumer Affordable Water Program. Any person who is an occupant of premises served by the Buffalo Water Board, and who qualifies pursuant to the annual income limits and family size schedule set by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), may apply to the Buffalo Water Board, by use of such applications, and procedures as may be established, and modified, from time to time by the Commissioner. Upon certification by the Commissioner that the applicant is qualified as (1) a low income consumer, such person shall be entitled to receive a credit not to exceed \$82.00 per year, or \$20.50 per quarter,

which will be applied against the capacity charge set forth herein, or (2) a very low income consumer, such person shall be entitled to receive a credit not to exceed \$112.00 per year, or \$28.00 per quarter which will be applied against the capacity charge set forth herein. Such credit shall be applied by the Buffalo Water Board, and shall be stated in the invoices and/or receipts issued by the Buffalo Water Board for water service to such low income consumer or very low income consumer, respectively. The annual income limits are subject to change each year, or whenever the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development announces any modification of such annual income limits, whereupon such change shall become immediately effective and applicable to the Buffalo Water Board and all residential consumers, without any further notice. The 2023 Annual Income Limits are provided by a link below to the United States Housing and Urban Development (HUD) data base and website for Median Family Income Estimates and Income Limits. They are subject to change in the future and when changed will automatically become effective for the Buffalo Water Board Schedule of Rates, Fees and Charges and when changed, such amounts are incorporated herein by reference.
